Hogs Hockey Is Back

The Rockford IceHogs celebrate their 22nd season of hockey in the Stateline and their 14th in the American Hockey League during the 2020-21 campaign.

King Ready for Season Two

IceHogs Head Coach Derek King enters his second season behind the bench alongside assistant coach Anders Sorensen. Last season, King led the IceHogs into the Central Division playoff push and finished with a record of 29-30-2-2. In 127 as active coach of the IceHogs (including interim in 2018-19) King holds an all-time record of 58-58-5-6.

Mitchell Leads the Charge

Yesterday, the IceHogs announced that veteran forward Garrett Mitchell was named the 13th team captain in AHL team history. Defenseman Cody Franson and forward John Quenneville will serve as alternate captains for the 2020-21 season.

Young Hogs Look to Gain Experience

The 2020-21 Opening Night Roster for the IceHogs features 29 players including 16 rookies. Evan Barratt, Isaak Phillips, Cam Morrison, Wyatt Kalynuk, Mitchell Fossier, Michal Tepy Chris Wilkie, Chad Yetman, Cole Moberg, Michael Krutil, Riley McKay, Alec Regula, D.J. Busdeker, Cale Morris and Tom Aubrun all look to make their AHL debuts.

Next Wave of Blackhawks

The IceHogs roster features 10 players that were drafted by the Blackhawks from 2016-20 including forward Chad Yetman (sixth round, 172 overall) and defensemen Michael Krutil (fourth round, 110 overall) and Isaak Phillips (fifth round, 141 overall) who were selected in this past summer's NHL Entry Draft.

Hello Old Friend

The IceHogs 14th AHL season also marks the 14th year of their in-state rivalry with the Chicago Wolves. Last season, the IceHogs raced out to a 5-0-0-0 record vs. CHI, their best start ever and longest winning streak against the Wolves, before finishing with a 6-2-1-0 head-to-head record.

Like Father, Like Son

The Wolves' roster features defenseman D.J. King, son of IceHogs Head Coach Derek King. The 20-year-old blueliner begins his rookie season after skating with Saginaw (OHL) last season with current IceHogs forward D.J. Busdeker.

Leaders of the Pack

Forward Jeremy Morin (2010-16) leads the IceHogs all-time against the Wolves with 33 points (15g, 18a) in 37 career games. Forward Brett Sterling leads the Wolves' side with 43 points (18g, 25a) in 50 career games vs. IceHogs.

Derek King - Head Coach

Derek King enters his fifth season as a coach of the Rockford IceHogs in 2020-21 and second as the team's Head Coach. He was named Interim Head Coach on November 6, 2018 after Jeremy Colliton was promoted to the Chicago Blackhawks of the National Hockey League after serving as an assistant coach since 2016. A native of Hamilton, Ont., King has helped coach the Toronto Marlies (AHL) to one Western Conference Championship and three divisional titles.

Prior to his coaching debut with the IceHogs in 2016-17, King, served as the Assistant Coach of the Owen Sound Attack of the Ontario Hockey League (OHL). Prior to his time in the OHL, King was an assistant and associate coach of the Toronto Marlies from 2009-15. The Toronto Marlies captured the Western Conference Championship in 2012 and won the North Division in 2012, 2013, and 2014. The Marlies collected a combined record of 243-166-26-30 under King's tutelage.

He began his coaching career as a player-assistant coach with the Grand Rapids Griffins, serving in that role in both the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. He collected 22 goals and 49 assists in 136 games with the Griffins.

King was drafted #13 overall by the New York Islanders in the 1985 NHL Entry Draft, and went on to play 14 seasons in the NHL, 11 of those with the team that originally drafted him. The left wing notched 261 goals and 351 assists for 612 points in 830 NHL games. He also accrued 417 PIM. Along with the Islanders (1986-97), King's NHL career includes stops with the Hartford Whalers (1996-97), Toronto Maple Leafs (1997-00), and St. Louis Blues (1999-00). During his final stop with the Blues, he played under former Chicago Blackhawks Head Coach Joel Quenneville.

Anders Sorensen - Assistant Coach

Sorensen is in his seventh season as development coach for the Chicago Blackhawks and was named to the Assistant Coach position on January 4, 2019, replacing Sheldon Brookbank who was named an assistant coach with the Blackhawks the same day. Prior to working with the Blackhawks, the Södertälje, Sweden, native spent the 2014-15 season as head coach of the Chicago Mission U16 club and the 2010-11 season as head coach of the Chicago Mission U18 team.

Sorensen was previously an assistant coach with the Swedish Hockey League's Södertälje from 2011-13 before serving as interim head coach in October 2013.
