## LONG TIME SINCE THE OPENER

It has been only 27 days since the Chicago Wolves faced the Rockford IceHogs in their 2021-22 season opener, but both teams are in markedly different places than the Oct. 16 night when the IceHogs rallied for a 5-3 victory at Allstate Arena.

The Central Division-leading Wolves have gone 6-1-0-0 since that night as head coach **Ryan Warsofsky**'s crew has outscored its foes 27-15 over that stretch. Considering one of those Goals Against was an empty-netter, Chicago's stout defense has been surrendering just two goals per game.

In addition, the Wolves have established one of the best lines in the AHL as captain **Andrew Poturalski** (the reigning AHL Player of the Month) serves as the center for left wing **C.J. Smith** and right wing **Stefan Noesen**. They have teamed up for 11 goals and 22 assists in the first eight games to pace an offense that ranks fourth in the 31-team AHL with 3.75 goals per game.

On the other side of this intrastate rivalry, the IceHogs have posted a 2-4-1-0 record since Oct. 16 – in part due to consistent shuffling with their NHL affiliate, the Chicago Blackhawks. Not only have seven players moved between the two teams, the Blackhawks tabbed IceHogs head coach Derek King to take over at the United Center on Nov. 6 after firing head coach Jeremy Colliton and two of his assistants.

Interim Rockford head coach Anders Sorensen is a familiar face on the local hockey scene. He and Wolves assistant coach **Bob Nardella** coached multiple Chicago Mission teams together – including the standout 2014-15 16U squad that featured current Wolves rookie center **Jack Drury**.

## CHATFIELD ENTERS THE CHAT

Wolves defenseman **Jalen Chatfield** has scored a goal in each of the last three games. His giveand-go with C.J. Smith gave the Wolves a 3-2 lead in their 6-3 win at Grand Rapids on Oct. 31, he scored Chicago's lone goal on Nov. 6 and he delivered the game-winner in Sunday's 4-2 victory over Milwaukee.

This three-game goal streak puts him on a short list of prolific Wolves blueliners. He became just the third defenseman since 2004-05 to produce such a run during the regular season. **Vince Dunn**, now with the Seattle Kraken, recorded four goals during his three-game streak Feb. 22-26, 2017. If Chatfield scores today, then he'll match **Nic Hague**'s streak. Hague, now part of the Vegas Golden Knights' top defensive pairing, delivered five goals in a four-game stretch Dec. 5-15, 2018.

The gold standard for a goal streak by a Wolves defenseman was set during the 2008 Calder Cup Playoffs when **Joel Kwiatkowski** notched a goal in SEVEN consecutive games. He started his spree ∠ during Game 2 of the Western Conference Finals against Toronto and continued through Game 3 of the Calder Cup Finals against Wilkes-Barre/Scranton.

# CHICAGO W ME NOTES

## BY THE NUMBERS

The Wolves have committed just one major penalty this season, which is the fewest in the AHL. Chicago didn't commit any in its first seven games, but forward Kyle Marino picked a crucial time to break that streak during Sunday's 4-2 win over Milwaukee. The Wolves surrendered two power-play goals in the opening 6:05 to fall behind 2-0, but Marino and the Admirals' Mathieu Olivier went toe-to-toe prior to the next faceoff. Because they fought before the faceoff, both spent the rest of the day in the dressing room – but Marino's momentum-shifting tussle was recognized by his teammates when he received the "Golden Helmet" that gets presented to the team's MVP during the brief postgame talk after each win.

When center Andrew Poturalski (3G, 2A) and left wing C.J. Smith (1G, 4A) each put up five points in a 6-3 win on Oct. 31 at Grand Rapids, it marked just the third time in the Wolves' 2,332 games that at least two Wolves scored five points in the same game. **Rob Brown** (2G, 6A), Dan Currie (4G, 1A) and Steve Maltais (2G, 3A) achieved the feat during a 10-3 win over the Kansas City Blades on March 24, 1996, then Jason Krog (3G, 4A) and Brett Sterling (2G, 3A) made it happen Nov. 4, 2006, in a 10-5 win at Peoria.

Fifth-year pro Jalen Chatfield owns four goals in eight games this year. Not only do those four goals lead all AHL blueliners, he already has doubled his previous career-high for goals. Chatfield posted two tallies in 60 games during the 2017-18 season for the Utica (AHL) Comets. Prior to joining the Wolves, he had gone 109 games (91 in the AHL and 18 in the NHL) without scoring a goal.

When center Jamieson Rees was loaned to the Wolves Thursday, it marked just the fifth roster move during the first month of the year as their NHL partner, the Carolina Hurricanes, // has broken out to a 10-1-0 start. Over the weekend, Opening Night goaltender Alex Lyon was recalled by the Hurricanes while goaltender Beck Warm was reassigned from Norfolk (ECHL) to the Wolves. Warm, who was named the Central Division's All-Star goaltender last season, has produced a 4-1-0 record with a 2.48 goals-against average and a .921 save percentage in five appearances for Norfolk. On Tuesday, veteran forward Josh Leivo was recalled by the Hurricanes, which inspired the Wolves to recall center **Stephen Harper** from Fort Wayne (ECHL). Harper, who posted three goals and six assists in five games for the Komets, would make his AHL debut if he plays tonight.

When Andrew Poturalski and C.J. Smith unleashed their five-point efforts on Halloween at Grand Rapids, they became the 10th and 11th Wolves to produce a fivepoint game in the franchise's 28-season history. Steve Maltais and Rob Brown posted five such games while Jason Krog notched four. Dan Currie and Cory Larose each achieved the feat twice while Lonny Bohonos, Brooks Macek, Spencer Machacek and Brett Sterling each did it once.

Since the Wolves organization played its first game on Oct. 1, 1994, a total of 706 players have suited up for Chicago. Forward Kyle Marino was the latest to make his debut when he played Oct. 31 at Grand Rapids. When forward Paul Cotter made his debut with the Vegas Golden Knights Tuesday night and goaltender Zach Fucale made his debut with the Washington Capitals Thursday night, they became the 413th and 414th Wolves to compete in the greatest league in the world. Put another way, 58.6 percent of all Wolves have played in the NHL.
