TONIGHT'S GAME

Winners of a season-high four straight games, the Texas Stars (13-7-2-2) are back in Rosemont, Illinois, to take on the Chicago Wolves (6-12-2-0) for a third straight meeting, as well as their fifth in the past three weeks.

The Stars swept the Wolves on the road in Chicago three weeks ago (Nov. 25-26), where they won the games 6-1 and 5-1, before completing another sweep on home ice with 5-2 and 6-1 wins last weekend.

Texas comes into tonight's contest with wins in six of their last seven games, which includes four wins over Chciago in the mix. Chicago meets with Texas again having dropped three straight, which includes its last two to the Stars in Cedar Park last Friday and Saturday. Prior to that, the Wolves came off a road split at lowa where they claimed a 4-0 victory, before falling 7-0 to the Wild on Dec. 3-4 in Des Moines.

PREVIOUS GAME

The Texas Stars took down the Chicago Wolves 6-1 in front of a season-high crowd of 6,126 Stars fans that watched them complete a two-game series sweep Saturday night.

Texas opened the scoring at 11:43 of the opening frame when Ben Gleason tapped in a saucer pass from the right dasher by Riley Tufte.

The second period saw Riley Damiani extend the lead to 2-0 at 2:26 when he beat Zachary Sawchenko blocker-side from the slot. Then at 10:29, Riley Barber fired a rebound into the net to make it 3-0.

In the third period, Marian Studenic made it 4-0 when he beat a sprawled out Sawchenko on the power play at 2:28. At the 13:51 mark, Jacob Peterson scored the Stars' second power-play goal of the night when he shelfed one over Sawchenko's right shoulder into the top-left corner to make it 5-0. After Chicago salvaged its lone goal at 15:32, Fredrik Karlstrom potted one more goal shorthanded on a breakaway that guided Texas to a 6-1 victory and its' first home series sweep since March 25-26, 2022, vs. Milwaukee.



PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Matt Murray returned to the Texas Stars' goal this past weekend for the first time since Nov. 23 at Rockford when he started Friday and Saturday night against the Chicago Wolves at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park. After stopping 17 of 19 shots in the Stars' 5-2 win Friday night, Murray backstopped Texas to a 6-1 victory while making 22 saves Saturday night. This season, the product of UMass-Amherst is 5-4-1 with one shutout, a 2.48 GAA and .901 save pct.

NEWS & NOTES

GETTIN' DANGEROUS IN DECEMBER

The Texas Stars currently possess a season-high four-game winning streak that begin back on December 2nd and featured a pair of series sweeps over Central Division foes in Grand Rapids (4-1 & 6-3 wins, Dec. 2-3) on the road and the Chicago Wolves (5-2 & 6-1 wins, Dec. 9-10) at home in Cedar Park. It's the Stars' longest streak of wins since they chained together four to close out the 2021-22 regular season, where they secured one of the final spots in the 2022 Calder Cup Playoffs. March 25-April 3 of last season marks the last time the Stars accumulated five consecutive victories.

All together in the past seven games for Texas, the Stars have mustered up six wins to maintain grasp on the second spot in the American Hockey League's Central Division with 30 points. Currently leading the Central with 31 points in 23 games are the Milwaukee Admirals.

COLLECTING TEXAS-SIZED WINS

Following a trend that saw 12 of the Stars' first 16 games this season decided by two or less goals, in Texas' last eight games, seven of the contests have been determined by three or more goals. Since falling 7-2 to Rockford to open the most recent road trip back on Nov. 23, the Stars have outscored opponents 34-12 in the meantime while only experiencing one loss by a lesser margin to Milwaukee (3-2). After claiming their third three-goal victory in a row Friday night by a 5-2 final score, the Stars routed the Wolves to pick up a 6-1 victory for their fourth win in a row.

In games decided by three or more goals this season, Texas is 9-3 in comparison to games that are decided by two goals or less where the Stars own a 4-4-2-2 record. Texas is 1-1 overall this year in twogoal games as well as 3-3-2-2 in contests that have been decided by one goal this year.

BENDING BUT NOT BREAKING

The Texas penalty kill is grasping the top spot in the American Hockey League's rankings with an 88% success rate so far this season. After stopping all eight of Grand Rapids' power play chances in the finale on Dec. 3 up in Michigan, Texas held Chicago's power play unit off the score sheet seven times throughout last weekend's two-game series in Cedar Park. In their last eight games out, Texas has limited opponents to just a pair of power-play goals while the Stars mixed in four short-handed markers during that same span. Texas has killed off 29 consecutive penalties, going back to Nov. 29.

Accompanying the Stars' top penalty-kill ranking thus far, Texas also leads the AHL outright with six short-handed goals this season. The Stars' most recent short-handed marker came when Fredrik Karlstrom iced Saturday's 6-1 victory over Chicago with a breakway goal and 2:23 remaining. Six different Stars players have scored short-handed this season. Among them are: Riley Damiani, Rhett Gardner, Thomas Harley, Karlstrom, Jacob Peterson and Alexander Petrovic.

GARDNER - THE GIFT THAT KEEPS ON GIVING

Stars' forward Rhett Gardner has been among the strongest two-way forces in the AHL this season. With 15 points (2-13=15) in 24 games played, the Moose Jaw, Sask., native ranks fourth in the AHL and leads the Stars with a +13 plus-minus rating this season. Additionally, Gardner, a force on the penalty kill, also is tied for team-lead with a pair of short-handed assists as well as a goal on the penalty kill of his own. Now riding a four-game point streak that has seen him post six assists during the stretch, Gardner owns the Stars' second-longest active point streak and has yet go a game in December without recording a point. In the current month, he leads the team with six points (0-6=6).

2022-23 COACHING STAFF



NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (4th Season)



Neil Graham was promoted to head coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019 to fill the vacancy left by Derek Laxdal who was promoted to assistant coach of the Dallas Stars the same day. The following night he earned his first win as the head coach of the Stars, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2-2 record at the helm. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, joining the team for his first stint of coaching at the American Hockey League level. Graham, 36, entered his second season with the Stars in 2020-21 and navigated a group that finished the year as the AHL's third lowest penalized team and among the top-five teams in power play goals (28). The club also housed two of the league's top-10 scorers (Riley Damiani & Adam Mascherin) including AHL Rookie of the Year honors for Damiani. Before making the move to Cedar Park, Texas, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons. Graham guided the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four of his campaigns at the helm.

The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (4th Season)



Travis Morin was promoted to assistant coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019. Morin was previously hired as Skills Coach and Director of Business Development with the organization on July 31, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for a pair of games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 37, ended his playing career with the Texas Stars after the 2018-19 season after 10 years with the organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that saeason. Morin is also the organizations most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games. Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the South Carolina Stingrays in the ECHL and Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (2nd Season)



Max Fortunus was hired as assistant coach of the Texas Stars on May 20, 2021. It is his first coaching position following a 17-year professional career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent with the Stars including a three-year stint as team captain. Fortunus, 38, moved behind the bench after spending the previous three seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21.

Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks third in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fourth in assists (123), sixth in points (167) and 16th in goals (44), while he ranks first among defensemen in club history in each category. Fortunus won the 2014 Calder Cup with Texas, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. 


