TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (11-7-2-2) are playing their first home game since departing on a six-game road trip prior to Thanksgiving, and host the Chicago Wolves (6-10-2-0) tonight at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park.

In the previous meetings, which was part of the Stars' six-game road stretch, Texas swept Chicago with 6-1 and 5-1 wins Nov. 25-26. The Wolves claimed the first game, winning 3-1 in Chicago back on Oct. 25.

Texas comes into this weekend's affair after picking up four of six possible wins on its two-week road trip around the midwest, which concluded with a two-game sweep (4-1 and 6-3) over Grand Rapids Dec. 2-3. Chicago enters the series coming off a split on the road at lowa where they claimed a 4-0 victory, before falling 7-0 to the Wild on Dec. 3-4 in Des Moines.

PREVIOUS GAME

The Texas Stars stormed past the Grand Rapids Griffins 6-3 after scoring five goals in the opening period last Saturday at Van Andel Arena.

Thomas Harley opened the five-goal first period by burying a rebound 2:51 into the contest. Then, Fredrik Olofsson tipped in a point shot by Alexander Petrovic at 4:45 to make it 2-0. On the power play at 8:42, Riley Damiani made it 3-0 when he capitalized on a rebound near the left-side of the net. Matej Blumel scored the Stars' fourth goal at the 10:57 mark minutes before Trenton Bliss put the Griffins in the score column at 13:37. Scoring in the first frame concluded when Tanner Kero chipped in a no-look feed by Riley Barber with 1:58 left in the opening period.

After Taro Hirose opened second period scoring 22 seconds in, Damiani potted his second goal of at 14:51 of the middle frame to make it 6-2 Stars.

The third period saw only one goal as Pontus Andreasson scored with 19 seconds left to cut the deficit to three. However, Texas skated away with a 6-3 victory to complete the two-game series sweep.



PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Riley Damiani surged last time out at Grand Rapids. The Mississauga, Ont., native posted three points (2-1=3) in the Stars' 6-3 victory over Grand Rapids last Saturday. Each of Damiani's goals were scored as part of a special teams effort. After scoring his first goal on the power play in the first, he scored a second one shorthanded in the second period. Additionally, he recorded an assist in the Stars' last game against the Wolves, a 5-1 win on Nov. 26.

NUMBERS FROM NOVEMBER

Leading the way in November, Riley Barber set himself apart from the Stars' roster offensively by posting 11 points (5-6=11) in 12 games where he fired a team-high 50 shots on goal. Will Butcher led Texas with seven assists during the month. In addition, Rhett Gardner turned it on while sporting a team-leading plus-minus rating of +10 throughout November while recording seven points (1-6=7) in 12 games. Between the pipes for the Stars, Anton Khudobin carried the reins in the second half of last month while backstopping the Stars in eight games where he was 4-2-1 with a 2.17 goals-against average and .928 save percentage.

CLOSE GAMES, NO MORE

Following a trend that saw 12 of the Stars' first 16 games decided by two or less goals, Texas' most recent six-game stretch away from home saw five of the six contests decided by three or more goals. After falling 7-2 to Rockford to open the trip Nov. 23, the Stars outscored opponents 23-9 in the remaining five games and only suffered one more loss by a 3-2 margin to Milwaukee.

In games decided by three or more goals this season, Texas is 7-3 in comparison to games that are decided by two goals or less where the Stars own a 4-4-2-2 record on the season. Texas is 1-1 overall this year in two-goal games as well as 3-3-2-2 in contests that have been decided by one goal this

PK CLIMBS AHL'S PEAK, PP SNAPS THE STREAK

The Texas penalty kill reached the top of the American Hockey League rankings with a newly acquired 87.1% success rate following last Saturday's showing that saw the Stars kill off each of the Griffins' eight power plays. Over the course of the six-game road stretch, the Stars limited their opponents to just a pair of power-play goals while also scoring a pair of shorthanded markers in the mix.

On the other end of the spectrum, power-play numbers for the Stars have been down. However, Texas snapped a six-game skid of not capitalizing with the man advantage when Riley Damiani scored on the power play in the first period of the Stars last game at Grand Rapids, a 6-3 win. In terms of league rankings, the Stars have fallen from once being among the AHL's top-10 teams with the advantage, to 23rd in the league with an 18.4% success rate.

PETRO'S POINT STREAK

Alternate captain Alex Petrovic is pacing well ahead of his career-best numbers just 22 games into the regular season. The 11th-year pro picked up another point last game with an assist in the Stars' 6-3 win at Grand Rapids. This season, Petrovic has already set a career high for himself with seven goals, which ranks him third in goal-scoring among AHL defensemen. For reference, he scored five goals in 71 games for Texas in 2021-22, a personal best for the veteran defenseman, which included two gamewinning goals. His 19 total points from a season ago was one shy of his best (20 points), which he set twice (2014-15 with San Antonio and 2019-20 with Providence).

In total, he now has 11 points with seven goals and four assists in 21 games played this season. Petrovic also leads the Stars with a plus-11 rating.

NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (4th Season)



Neil Graham was promoted to head coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019 to fill the vacancy left by Derek Laxdal who was promoted to assistant coach of the Dallas Stars the same day. The following night he earned his first win as the head coach of the Stars, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2-2 record at the helm. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, joining the team for his first stint of coaching at the American Hockey League level. Graham, 36, entered his second season with the Stars in 2020-21 and navigated a group that finished the year as the AHL's third lowest penalized team and among the top-five teams in power play goals (28). The club also housed two of the league's top-10 scorers (Riley Damiani & Adam Mascherin) including AHL Rookie of the Year honors for Damiani. Before making the move to Cedar Park, Texas, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons. Graham guided the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four of his campaigns at the helm.

The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (4th Season)



Travis Morin was promoted to assistant coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019. Morin was previously hired as Skills Coach and Director of Business Development with the organization on July 31, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for a pair of games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 37, ended his playing career with the Texas Stars after the 2018-19 season after 10 years with the organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that saeason. Morin is also the organizations most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games. Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the South Carolina Stingrays in the ECHL and Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (2nd Season)



Max Fortunus was hired as assistant coach of the Texas Stars on May 20, 2021. It is his first coaching position following a 17-year professional career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent with the Stars including a three-year stint as team captain.

Fortunus, 38, moved behind the bench after spending the previous three seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21.

Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks third in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fourth in assists (123), sixth in points (167) and 16th in goals (44), while he ranks first among defensemen in club history in each category. Fortunus won the 2014 Calder Cup with Texas, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1). Additionally, he spent parts of two seasons with Louisiana of the ECHL from 2003-05, registering 42 points (11-31=42) in 123 games. Prior to his professional debut in 2003-04, Fortunus logged 148 points (40-108=148) in 285 career games in five seasons with Baie-Comeau Drakkar of the QMJHL, earning QMJHL First All-Star Team honors and winning the Emile Bouchard Trophy as the QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 2002-03.

RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (2nd Season)



Ryan Daniels was hired as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars on June 8, 2021 after spending the previous three years with the Guelph Storm of the Ontario Hockey League. In his tenure, Guelph captured the 2019 OHL Championship and competed in the 2019 Memorial Cup.

He spent the previous three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to coaching in the OHL, Daniels spent time as the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, who won back to back Buckland Cups.

Daniels played 5 seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes and was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006. He also played 4 varsity seasons at Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was named a 2nd Team All Canadian and a two time OUA West MVP. While at Wilfrid Laurier University, Daniels received his Bachelor of Business Administration with Honours. He was also an Academic All Canadian.

CHRIS DEMCZUK - Video Coordinator (1st Season)



Demczuk comes to Texas from Colorado College (NCAA), where he served as the Director of Hockey Operations in 2021-22. He led video operations, coordinated team travel and meals, and assisted the Tigers coaching staff with pre-game preparation and post-game breakdown.

Prior to Colorado College, Demczuk held the role of Video Analyst and Team Services Manager for the Stockton Heat (AHL), where he led video operations, oversaw the team's operational budget and coordinated team travel for two seasons.

Demczuk joined the Heat prior to the 2019-20 season after six years with the Penn State University's women's hockey program, including two seasons as Director of Operations. Demczuk also served on Team USA's staff as a video coach for several tournaments during that time.

A native of Gillette, N.J., Demczuk graduated from Penn State in 2017 with a bachelor's degree in Journalism. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in Sports Industry Management from Georgetown University.




