# 2023-24 COACHING STAFF



## NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (5th Season)



Neil Graham was promoted to head coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019 to fill the vacancy left by Derek Laxdal who was promoted to assistant coach of the Dallas Stars the same day. The following night he earned his first win as the head coach of the Stars, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2-2 record at the helm. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, joining the team for his first stint of coaching at the American Hockey League level. Graham, 38, led the Stars to their first Calder Cup playoff appearance since 2018 in 2021-22, ending with a first round loss to Rockford. He guided Texas to the top of the Central Division in 2022-23, as the Stars won their first division title since 2014. The Stars swept Rockford in the 2023 division semifinals before coming up just short against Milwaukee in the division finals.

Before making the move to Cedar Park, Texas, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons and guided the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four of his campaigns at the helm. The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

## TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (5th Season)



Travis Morin was promoted to assistant coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for a pair of games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 39, ended his playing career with the Texas Stars following the 2018-19 season after 10 years with the organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season. Morin is also the organization's most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games.

Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the South Carolina Stingrays in the ECHL and Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

## MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (3rd Season)



Max Fortunas was hired as assistant coach of the Texas Stars on May 20, 2021. It is his first coaching position following a 17-year professional career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent with the Stars including a three-year stint as team captain. Fortunas, 40, moved behind the bench after spending the previous three seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21.

Fortunas spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunas was named Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks third in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fourth in assists (123), sixth in points (167) and 16th in goals (44), while he ranks first among defensemen in club history in each category. Fortunas won the 2014 Calder Cup with Texas, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1). Additionally, he spent parts of two seasons with Louisiana of the ECHL from 2003-05, registering 42 points (11-31=42) in 123 games. Prior to his professional debut in 2003-04, Fortunas logged 148 points (40-108=148) in 285 career games in five seasons with Baie-Comeau Drakkar of the QMJHL, earning QMJHL First All-Star Team honors and winning the Emile Bouchard Trophy as the QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 2002-03.

## RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (3rd Season)



Ryan Daniels was hired as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars on June 8, 2021 after spending the previous three years with the Guelph Storm of the Ontario Hockey League. In his tenure, Guelph captured the 2019 OHL Championship and competed in the 2019 Memorial Cup.

He spent the previous three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to coaching in the OHL, Daniels spent time as the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, who won back to back Buckland Cups.

Daniels played 5 seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes and was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006. He also played four varsity seasons at Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was named a 2nd Team All Canadian and a two time OUA West MVP. While at Wilfrid Laurier University, Daniels received his Bachelor of Business Administration with Honours. He was also an Academic All Canadian.

## JOSH JOHNSON - Video Coach (1st Season)



Josh Johnson was hired as the Texas Stars video coach in the summer of 2023 after spending two seasons as the director of hockey operations for the University of St Thomas men's hockey program. While at UST from 2021-23, he oversaw the Tommies' video coordination and analytics, community outreach and travel arrangements. Johnson previously served as the video coordinator for Robert Morris University in 2020-21, where he handled practice and game film, video breakdown and analytics.

The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an analytics and video assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.

## TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (0-2-0-0) are playing their first game of the season away from home today against the Chicago Wolves (0-0-1-0) at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois.

Texas is coming off a pair of losses on home ice on opening weekend against the Tucson Roadrunners by final scores of 3-2 on Friday and 2-1 on Saturday.

Chicago opened its season last Saturday night hosting Milwaukee, where the Wolves fell 2-1 to the Admirals in overtime. Wolves' forward Nathan Sucece scored the lone goal for Chicago while former Stars' netminder Adam Scheel turned aside 35 of the 37 shots he faced in the contest.

Texas had Chicago's number in last season's head-to-head series. The Stars came out on top in six of the eight meetings between the Central Division foes and outcored the Wolves by a 33-17 margin.

## LAST TIME OUT...

The Texas Stars fell victim of a two-game, opening-weekend sweep to the Tucson Roadrunners after losing in the finale, 2-1, Saturday night in Cedar Park.

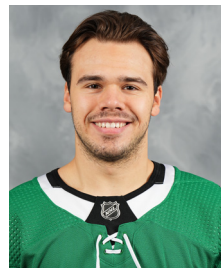
Texas played in front of its first sellout crowd of the season in the series finale as 6,778 Stars fans packed the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park.

Tucson struck first in Saturday's contest when Dylan Guenther beat Matt Murray through the legs on a breakaway 10:32 into the first period. Tucson carried the 1-0 lead into the first intermission after both sides posted nine shots on goal in the opening frame.

The Roadrunners added to their lead when Max Szuber scored with 1:50 left in the period. Despite outshooting Tucson 9-4 in the second period and leading 18-13 through two periods, Texas trailed Tucson, 2-0, after 40 minutes of action.

Stars' forward Logan Stankoven cut the deficit to one 6:13 into the final frame. However, that was all Texas could manage in the 2-1 loss to Tucson that closed out opening weekend.

Matthew Villalta earned his second win in a row to open the season after stopping 35 of 36 shots. For the Stars, Murray came down with the loss after making saves on 15 of the 17 shots he saw.



## PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Logan Stankoven, a rookie forward for Texas out of Kamloops, British Columbia, leads the Stars with a pair of points after scoring goals in back-to-back games. The Kamloops Blazers (WHL) product placed four shots on goal in the series against the Tucson Roadrunners. Stankoven ranks tied for fifth in the American Hockey League and shares first among the league's rookies with two goals after the first weekend. The right-shot forward was selected by Dallas in the 2nd round (47th overall) of the 2021 National Hockey League Draft.

## THE HEAD-TO-HEAD

In last season's series, Texas dominated Chicago to the tune of a 3-1 mark at home and on the road for a 6-2 record overall.

After falling in the first meeting against Chicago last season, which was an 11:00 a.m. start in Illinois, Texas rattled off three straight victories the rest of the season in the games played at Allstate Arena.

Only one of the eight meetings between the Central foes needed overtime last season as Mar. 25 saw Texas win 4-3 in OT in Cedar Park.

In the eight games last season, Texas totaled 33 goals and surrendered 17 to Chicago for a plus-16 in goal differential.

## SERIES HISTORY

Texas and Chicago have met 78 times in history, with the Stars holding a 43-29-3-3 advantage in the all-time series.

Additionally, the Stars carry a 23-14-0-3 all-time record on the road ice against the Wolves into Wednesday's contest.

In terms of goal differential, the Stars possess a plus-25 advantage with a 247-222 margin over the Wolves.

In the first-ever meeting between the Wolves and Stars back on Oct. 31, 2009, in Cedar Park, Texas routed Chicago 4-1. Current Texas Stars Assistant Coach Maxime Fortunus recorded an assist on the Stars' game-winning goal.

## NEWS & NOTES

### THE HUNT FOR A WIN

After falling victim to a sweep in opening weekend while hosting the Tucson Roadrunners at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park, the Texas Stars find themselves hitting the road for the first time in the new campaign still in search of a win. Texas is also seeking its' first lead of the season after having trailed or been tied with Tucson for the entirety of last weekend's series. In terms of offensive pressure, the Stars seemed to take command. Despite trailing by three shots on goal, 30-27, in the battle on Friday night, the Stars bounced back to outshoot the Roadrunners 36-17 on Saturday night in Cedar Park. The Stars power play lagged a bit in the first two games. After posting one goal on five looks in Friday's 3-2 loss, Texas was held at an 0-for-3 mark in Saturday's affair. Called upon three times in both games, the Stars' penalty killers surrendered just one goal on Friday night.

The Chicago Wolves are coming off a 2-1 overtime loss after hosting the Milwaukee Admirals last Saturday at Allstate Arena. While they were able to salvage a point, Chicago is also in pursuit of its first regulation win this season. The Wolves' power play has yet to connect this season after having nine unsuccessful cracks with the man advantage in their season-opener. They were a perfect six-for-six on the penalty kill. Statistically, Nathan Sucec has the lone goal for Chicago this year. Former Texas Star goaltender Adam Scheel got the first call for Chicago and stopped 35 of Milwaukee's 37 shots to salvage a point in the overtime loss.

### ROOKIES RISE UP

Following a quiet opening weekend offensively for the Stars, a pair of rookie forwards in Logan Stankoven and Kyle McDonald shined at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park, recording Texas' only goals throughout the weekend.

On Friday night, McDonald redirected a shot by Lian Bichsel, who was appearing in his first pro game in North America, for the first goal of the season, which tied the game 1-1 in the first period. After the Roadrunners reclaimed a 2-1 lead, Stankoven slapped in a loose puck on a power play during the second period to tie the game 2-2. It marked the Stars first power-play goal of the season.

Stankoven struck again on Saturday night on a one-timer passed by Mavrik Bourque, his second goal of the season cut the deficit to 2-1 and started a two-game scoring streak (2-0=2).

Six Texas Stars made their professional debuts last weekend against Tucson. Joining Stankoven, McDonald and Bichsel in the series were Francesco Arcuri, Christian Kyrou and Matthew Seminoff.

### WILL TEXAS TRAVEL WELL AGAIN?

Taking on Chicago and Milwaukee away from home this week, Texas is playing in its first road games since the 2022-23 campaign, a season that saw the Stars finish tied for seventh in the American Hockey League in terms of points earned (46) on enemy ice. The Stars were 19-9-7-1 in games played outside of Texas and recorded the second-most goals scored (128) in the AHL as a road team.

In games played against the Wolves at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois, the Stars were 3-1 last season, and are 23-14-0-3 all-time.

### THE MACK ATTACK

Curtis McKenzie inked one of Texas' biggest offseason signings on June 1 when the 11-year pro agreed to a two-year contract extension to remain the Stars' captain. The left-shot forward recorded an assist in the Stars' 3-2 opening-night loss to Tucson. McKenzie is Texas' top-returning scorer, coming off a season where he posted 22 goals and 32 assists for 54 points in 70 games played.

The Golden, British Columbia, native ranks third on the franchise leaderboard for points (295) and assists (170), second in goals (125) and first in penalty minutes (511). He has made three appearances in the Calder Cup Finals, including twice with Texas (2014 & 2018) and once with Chicago (2019).
