TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (32-18-3-0) finish out a three-game road trip this afternoon against the Chicago Wolves (28-23-3-0) at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois.

The Stars saw a four-game winning streak come to an end last night in a 4-2 loss to Rockford after defeating Milwaukee 4-3 in a shootout on Wednesday morning. Texas is currently only two points behind Milwaukee, with four games in hand, and can breakeven with the Admirals if the Stars win today.

Chicago lost their first three games of March, including two games in Cedar Park on Mar. 1-2 against Texas. The Wolves suffered a 3-1 defeat Friday in Milwaukee, but bounced back to beat Grand Rapids last night 5-4 in a thriller at Allstate Arena. Chicago wraps up a three-game weekend this afternoon in the fifth meeting of eight against the Stars.

PREVIOUS GAME

The Texas Stars fell 4-2 to the Rockford IceHogs Saturday night at the BMO Center in Illinois, snapping the Stars' four-game winning streak.

Rockford gained an early lead when Cole Guttman beat **Magnus Hellberg** just 58 seconds into the game. **Emilio Pettersen** tied the game nine minutes later when he banked the puck off Drew Comnesso for his fifth goal of the season and first of the night. Paul Ludwinski scored on a shot from the right faceoff circle with five minutes left in the first period to put the IceHogs up 2-1 after one.

Pettersen scored his second of the night thirteen minutes into the second period when he redirected a point shot past Comnesso, but Zach Sanford then scored from the backdoor on a 5-on-3 power play with just under two minutes left in the second period to make it 3-2. The Stars outshot Rockford 13-7 in the final frame, but couldn't find the tying goal, as Joey Anderson added an empty-net tally to seal the 4-2 final score.

Hellberg made 19 saves in the loss, while Comnesso made 36 stops in the win.

Texas Stars forward **Emilio Pettersen** scored twice in the Stars' 4-2 loss to Rockford on Saturday, The Norwegian forward now has 23 points (6-17=23) in 51 games in his first full season with Texas. Pettersen's last multi-goal game was against Milwaukee on April 7, 2024 after the Stars acquired the winger at the trade deadline. He had eight points (4-4=8) in 12 games late last season with the Stars and five points (2-3=5) in seven playoff games.

NEWS & NOTES

AMONG THE BEST

Leading the way for Texas during the team's strong finish to the homestand was **Matej Blumel**, who earned the AHL's Player of the Week honors with nine points (3-6=9) in four games. The third-year Stars winger added a short-handed goal Wednesday in Milwaukee and now ranks second in the AHL with 52 points (27-25=52) and 27 goals in 48 games played.

Upon returning to the AHL on Jan. 26 from a six-game stint in Dallas, Blumel has compiled 20 points (9-11=20) in just 16 games. He also has one NHL goal this season in seven appearances. The 2024 All-Star had 31 goals and 62 points (31-31=62) last season and surpassed 50 points for the second straight season in Sunday's win.

FOUR MORE OFTEN THAN NOT

Before Saturday's 4-2 loss, the AHL's highest scoring team had notched four goals in five straight games, including the final four games of their homestand and Wednesday's contest in Milwaukee. Texas leads the league with 3,51 goals per game and has now scored four or more goals 28 times in just 53 games. The Stars suffered a rare setback when scoring four times in a 6-4 loss Feb. 25 against Grand Rapids, but the team now 24-3-1-0 when putting the puck in the net at least four times, with only one loss since Christmas in those situations.

POWER STRUGGLE

The Stars have had one of the league's best power plays all season and currently rank third at 22.3%. However, Texas has struggled to draw penalties over the last couple of weeks. Entering Saturday's contest in Rockford, the Stars had just three power play opportunities over their previous four games, including two games with zero power plays. For comparison, the team has had zero power play opportunities in just six games in team history, including the two occasions already in March. Texas earned three power plays Saturday, but went 0-for-3 and one was cancelled out by a penalty that eventually turned into a 5-on-3 for Rockford, who went 2-for-6 with the man-advantage.

ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

One year ago the Texas Stars defeated the San Jose Barracuda in a 6-3 goal fest.

After a scoreless first period Mark Russel put Texas on the board first just under two minutes into the second period, followed by Matej Blumel 28 seconds later. Ozzy Wiesblatt cut the Barracuda's deficit to one with thirteen minutes left in the period, but Blumel notched his second of the game with seven seconds left until the second intermission. Jack Becker scored twice, one-and-a-half minutes apart, to put the Stars up 5-1 with seven minutes left in regulation. The Barracuda tried to mount a comeback, adding goals from Nikolai Knyzhov and Scott Sabourin, but Fredrik Karlstrom scored an empty-netter for Texas to end the game 6-3 Stars.

Matthew Murray earned the win after making 27 saves on 30 shots. Eetu Makiniemi was given the loss after giving up five goals on 29 shots.

Newcomer **Mikko Rantanen** scored in his Dallas debut after he was acquired at Friday's trade deadline, and **Jamie Benn** quickly scored again to make it 5-3 in the first 5:17 of the final frame. **Matt Dumba** made it 5-4 with just under 11 minutes to play, but Edmonton held on from there.

2024-25 COACHING STAFF



NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (6th Season)



Neil Graham is in his sixth season as head coach of the Texas Stars after leading the team to three straight Calder Cup Playoff appearances. He was promoted from assistant coach to head coach on December 10, 2019 and earned his first win the next night, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2 record. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, his first time coaching at the American Hockey League level.

Graham, 39, led the Stars to the 2022 Calder Cup Playoffs, their first postseason appearance since 2018, ending with a first round loss to Rockford. He then guided Texas to the top of the Central Division in 2022-23, as the Stars won their first division title since 2014. The Stars swept Rockford in the 2023 division semifinals before coming up just short against Milwaukee in the division finals. The Stars again qualified for the playoffs in 2023-24 and swept Manitoba in the opening round. During his tenure, Graham has coached two AHL Rookie of the Year winners (Riley Damiani, 2021, and Logan Stankoven, 2024), as well as the league's scoring champion and MVP (Mavrik Bourque, 2024). Before making the move to Cedar Park, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons, guiding the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four seasons at the helm. Prior to being appointed head coach on Aug. 7, 2015, Graham served as Steelheads assistant coach for two seasons, after a role as a player/coach during the 2012-13 campaign. The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (6th Season)



Travis Morin is in his sixth season working alongside Neil Graham on the Texas Stars bench. He was promoted to assistant coach on December 10, 2019 after previously being named the team's Skills Coach and Director of Business Development on July 31, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for two games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 40, ended his playing career following the 2018-19 season, after 10 years with the Stars organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season. Morin is also the organization's most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games. Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the ECHL's South Carolina Stingrays and AHL's Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (4th Season)



Max Fortunus is in his fourth season as assistant coach of the Texas Stars, after he was named to the staff on May 20, 2021. The former Stars defenseman returned to Cedar Park, following a 17-year playing career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent in Texas, including a three-year stint as team captain.

Fortunus, 41, previously spent his final three playing seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21. Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named an assistant captain for the 2011-12 campaign before serving as Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks fourth in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fifth in assists (123), and sixth in points (167), leading all club defensemen in each category. Fortunus made 10 trips to the Calder Cup Playoffs in his AHL career, logging 31 points (6-25=31) in 118 career AHL postseason games. Of his 10 career playoff appearances, five came with Texas, recording 15 points (2-13=15) in 63 Calder Cup Playoff games in a Texas sweater. Fortunus captained the Stars to the 2014 Calder Cup Championship, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1).

RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (4th Season)



Ryan Daniels is in his fourth season as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars. He was hired on June 8, 2021 and has worked with several Stars goaltending prospects, including NHL All-Star Jake Oettinger.

Daniels, 36, previously spent three years with the Ontario Hockey League's Guelph Storm, who captured the 2019 league championship and a spot in the 2019 Memorial Cup. He joined Guelph after three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to his time in major juniors, Daniels was the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, the back-to-back Buckland Cup OJHL champions in 2014 and 2015.

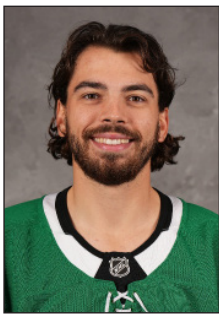
Daniels was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006 and played five seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes, where he accumulated 85 wins in 166 games. He was also a four-year varsity goaltender for Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was a 2nd Team All-Canadian and a two-time OUA West MVP.

He was hired in the summer of 2023 after spending two seasons as the director of hockey operations for the University of St. Thomas men's hockey program. While at UST from 2021-23, he oversaw the Tommies' video coordination and analytics, community outreach and travel arrangements. Johnson previously served as the video coordinator for Robert Morris University in 2020-21, where he handled practice and game film, video breakdown and analytics.

The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an analytics and video assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.
