TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars begin their 2026 Calder Cup Playoffs run tonight against the Chicago Wolves in Game One of the Central Division Semifinals at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park. The Stars are in the postseason for the fifth consecutive season and 12th time in franchise history.

Texas clinched third place in the Central Division by earning 80 points in the regular season. The Stars took seven of the eight matchups between the teams during the season series, including all four in the Lone Star State. The teams last clashed on Apr. 3-4 at the H-E-B Center.

Chicago finished in the second spot in the Central Division with 87 points. The Wolves are in the postseason for the second straight year after bowing out against the Rockford IceHogs in the First Round last season in two games.

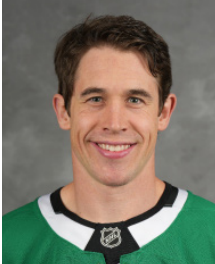
SEASON RECAP

Following a 0-5-1 start to the season, the Texas Stars finished the AHL season as one of the best second half teams in the league to claim the third seed in the Central Division and the final bye in the first round of the Calder Cup Playoffs.

The Stars qualified for the postseason for the fifth consecutive year and made it official for the second straight season with a win over Chicago. Texas punched its ticket Apr. 3 in a win over the Wolves at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park and will now begin a best-of-five Division Semifinal series against its division rival from the Windy City.

First-year head coach Toby Petersen took over the Stars bench this season and joined established assistants Travis Morin and Max Fortunus, along with captain Curtis McKenzie, to form a reunion of sorts. The four all played for Texas on the 2014 Calder Cup team, McKenzie's first pro season and Petersen's last, where Morin took home the AHL's MVP award and Fortunus captained the squad to the title.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT



Texas Stars forward **Curtis McKenzie** leads the Stars into the postseason for the 10th time since 2013 and the 11th time overall in his 13-year career. The Golden, BC native has skated in 104 Calder Cup Playoff games in his career, including 83 with Texas, which is second-most in team history behind assistant coach Travis Morin (87). McKenzie has the most playoff goals (26) in team history, and second-most points (60), behind Morin (64). The forward totaled 10 points (5-5=10) in the Stars run to the Western Conference Finals last season in 14 games.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

Tonight marks the first of a best-of-five Division Semifinal series, which begins in Cedar Park for Games One and Two, before the series shifts to Rosemont, Illinois for Game Three, and Games Four and Five if necessary, May 2, 3 and 5.

Texas prevailed in seven of the teams' eight matchups during the 2025-26 campaign, including all four at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park. Texas won 5-4 on Mar. 18 thanks to a two-goal night from **Cross Hanas**. **Harrison Scott** lit the lamp twice on Apr. 3 in a 3-1 victory, and **Jack Becker** put the Stars in front with 3:54 remaining in regulation to seal a 4-2 result in the season series finale.

SERIES HISTORY

Texas and Chicago have met 102 times in history, with the Stars holding a 59-36-4-3 advantage in the all-time series.

Additionally, the Stars carry a 28-18-4-0 all-time home record against the Wolves at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park. Texas also has the upper hand in the all-time goal differential by 43 total goals, a 334-291 margin.

The two teams had only met once in the Calder Cup Playoffs prior to this year, clashing in the 2010 Division Finals, where Texas outlasted Chicago 6-5 in overtime of Game 7 at Allstate Arena, eventually reaching the Calder Cup Final.

NEWS & NOTES

HUGE YEAR FOR HUGHES

Cameron Hughes was one of the main focal points of the Texas Stars offense this season. The Edmonton, Alberta native tallied a career-high 68 points (17-51=68) in 65 games. Hughes' 51 helpers ranked second and his 68 points were tied for third in the AHL. He also etched his name into the Texas Stars record books ranking fourth in franchise history for points in a season.

Hughes picked up multiple points in 32.3% of games he played during the regular season. He picked up two points in 14 games, three points in six games and was the only Stars skater to earn four points in a game on Feb. 28 vs San Diego. Since the last day of February, the Edmonton, Alberta native earned multiple points in seven of his last 14 games played to end the regular season. The forward has appeared in two Calder Cup Finals, both with Coachella Valley, in 2023 and 2024. He then was a part of the Stars run to the Western Conference Finals last season.

SETTING A NEW HIGH BAR

Hughes wasn't the only player who had a career-year this season for Texas. **Jack Becker**, **Cross Hanas**, **Michael Karow** and **Matthew Seminoff** all set new personal bests in scoring, and all five skaters earned at least 10 more points than their previous career highs.

Seminoff had a breakout season for the Stars. Through his first two seasons, he totaled 24 points (6-18=24) in 126 games. This season, Seminoff tallied 50 points (24-26=50) while playing in every game. The Leesburg, Virginia native led the Stars in goals and ranked second in points. Becker totaled 40 points (14-26=40) in 71 games played this season. His previous career high was last season, when he compiled 18 points (7-11=18). The Dellwood, Minnesota native ranked third on the Stars in points.

Hanas earned 38 points (15-23=38) in 56 games in his first season with the Stars, which was 21 points more than his previous high of 17, which he accomplished on two different occasions. Karow led all Stars defensemen with 28 points (10-18=28), and was one of 10 Stars with double-digit goals.

MAGNIFIQUE

Remi Poirier was the backbone for the Texas Stars this season. The netminder was relied upon heavily as his 52 games played ranked first and his 3017:08 minutes in net ranked second AHL. The Farnham, Quebec native also set the franchise record for wins (65) in his career in a Mar. 25 triumph at San Jose.

Poirier was especially excellent in the month of March, in which he earned the Goaltender of the Month award. He went 7-2-0 in nine starts, sporting a 2.27 goals against average and a .934 save percentage. This was the second straight March that he won the award. Poirier has suited up in 18 Calder Cup Playoff games in his career. He has a 2.16 goals against average and a .916 save percentage in those contests.

ON THIS DATE IN HISTORY

Apr. 28, 2023

On this date three years ago, Texas Stars defeated the Rockford IceHogs 5-3 in Game One of the Central Division Semifinals at the BMO Center. **Rhett Gardner** opened the scoring at the 12:44 mark of the first period. Joey Anderson knotted the game up on the power play with two seconds left in the opening frame. D.J. Busdeker put the IceHogs in front just 76 seconds into the middle frame. **Marian Studenic** found the equalizer with 5:27 left in the second period. Bobby Lynch gave Rockford the lead back in the first three minutes of the third period. Texas brought the score back to even on the power play with 14 minutes remaining when **Scott Reedy** lit the lamp. With 3:27 left in regulation, **Nick Caamano** put the Stars in front for the second time in the game. Rockford pulled Arvid Soderblom for an extra skater, and Studenic potted his second goal of the game to seal the playoff victory for Texas. **Matt Murray** made 25 saves in the win, while Soderblom allowed four goals on 39 shots in the loss.

2025-26 COACHING STAFF



TOBY PETERSEN - Head Coach (1st Season)



Toby Petersen was named the sixth Head Coach in Texas Stars history on July 7, 2025. With over 22 years of professional experience, both as a player and a coach in the AHL and NHL, the 2025-26 season is his first as a Head Coach. Petersen spent the last two seasons with the Colorado Avalanche as skills coach, working alongside the coaching staff and hockey operations department to maximize the development of the Avalanche and Colorado Eagles players during practices and on-ice sessions. He previously spent six seasons from 2014-20 as an assistant coach in the AHL with Springfield (2014-15), Lake Erie/Cleveland (2015-17) and Rochester (2017-20). During the 2016 Calder Cup Playoffs, Petersen helped guide the Lake Erie Monsters to a 15-2 playoff record on their way to winning the Calder Cup. In total, he has appeared in three Calder Cup Finals as a player (Wilkes-Barre/Scranton in 2001 and 2004, Texas in 2014) and one as a coach (Lake Erie in 2016), winning his last two appearances.

The Bloomington, Minnesota native played seven years in the Stars organization from 2007-14 as a member of the Dallas Stars (2007-13) and Texas Stars (2012-14). He appeared in 243 regular-season games with Dallas, totaling 40 points (17-23--40), also skating in 16 postseason games. Petersen served as an alternate captain in Texas and was part of the 2014 Calder Cup-winning team. In total, he compiled 36 points (13-2--36) in 108 regular-season games for the AHL's Stars, also appearing in 16 playoff contests. Originally drafted by the Pittsburgh Penguins in the ninth round (244th overall) of the 1998 NHL Draft, Petersen registered 81 points (33-48--81) and skated in 398 NHL regular-season games for three teams (Pittsburgh, Edmonton and Dallas). He also skated in 18 Stanley Cup Playoff games and scored one goal. In 550 career regular-season AHL contests with four teams (Texas, Iowa, Edmonton and Wilkes-Barre/Scranton), Petersen recorded 374 points (148-226--374), adding 36 points (12-24--36) in 71 Calder Cup Playoff games.

Prior to turning pro, Petersen played four seasons at Colorado College from 1996-00, where he earned a degree in psychology. Internationally, he represented the United States at the 1997 and 1998 IIHF World Junior Championship, winning a silver medal in 1997, and he later represented the U.S. Men's National Team at the 2007 World Championship.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (7th Season)



Travis Morin is in his seventh season on the Texas Stars bench, after he was promoted to Assistant Coach on December 10, 2019. He previously served as the team's Skills Coach and Director of Business Development during the shortened 2019-20 season, before joining the bench staff. Morin stepped in for then Head Coach Neil Graham for two games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 41, ended his playing career following the 2018-19 season, after 10 years with the Stars organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season.

Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University, Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75--133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the ECHL's South Carolina Stingrays and AHL's Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (5th Season)



Max Fortunus is in his fifth season as Assistant Coach of the Texas Stars, after he was named to the staff on May 20, 2021. The former Stars defenseman returned to Cedar Park following a 17-year playing career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent in Texas, including a three-year stint as Captain. Fortunus, 42, previously spent his final three playing seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43--50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an Assistant Captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21.

Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210--286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa, and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123--167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named an assistant captain for the 2011-12 campaign before serving as Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks fourth in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fifth in assists (123), and sixth in points (167), leading all club defensemen in each category. Fortunus made 10 trips to the Calder Cup Playoffs in his AHL career, logging 31 points (6-25--31) in 118 career AHL postseason games. Of his 10 career playoff appearances, five came with Texas, recording 15 points (2-13--15) in 63 Calder Cup Playoff games in a Texas sweater. Fortunus captained the Stars to the 2014 Calder Cup Championship, while he also reached the Calder Cup Finals in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game.

The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1--1). Additionally, he spent parts of two seasons with Louisiana of the ECHL from 2003-05, registering 42 points (11-31--42) in 123 games. Prior to his professional debut in 2003-04, Fortunus logged 148 points (40-108--148) in 285 career games in five seasons with Baie-Comeau Drakkar of the QMJHL, earning QMJHL First All-Star Team honors and winning the Emile Bouchard Trophy as the QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 2002-03.

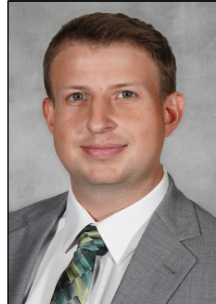
RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (5th Season)



Ryan Daniels is in his fifth season as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars. He was hired on June 8, 2021 and has worked with several Stars goaltending prospects, including NHL All-Star Jake Oettinger. Daniels, 37, previously spent three years with the Ontario Hockey League's Guelph Storm, who captured the 2019 league championship and a spot in the 2019 Memorial Cup. He joined Guelph after three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17.

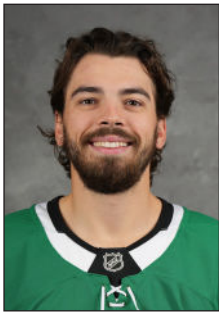
Prior to his time in major juniors, Daniels was the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, the back-to-back Buckland Cup OJHL champions in 2014 and 2015. Daniels was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006 and played five seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes, where he accumulated 85 wins in 166 games. He was also a four-year varsity goaltender for Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was a 2nd Team All-Canadian and a two-time OUA West MVP.

JOSH JOHNSON - Video Coach (3rd Season)



Josh Johnson is in his third season as the Texas Stars Video Coach. He was hired in the summer of 2023 after spending two seasons as the Director of Hockey Operations for the University of St. Thomas men's hockey program. While at UST from 2021-23, he oversaw the Tommies' video coordination and analytics, community outreach, and travel arrangements. Johnson previously served as the Video Coordinator for Robert Morris University in 2020-21, where he handled practice and game film, video breakdown, and analytics.

The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an Analytics and Video Assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.
