



Colorado Notes

GAME THREE- Colorado continues the Calder Cup Playoffs tonight with Game Three of the Western Conference Final against the Chicago Wolves, with the series tied at 1-1. This is the third straight series in which the Eagles have been tied 1-1 after the first two games, with Colorado having gone on to win each of those previous two series. Not only is this the Eagles first appearance in the Western Conference Final since joining the AHL, it is also the first time a Colorado Avalanche AHL affiliate has reached the Conference Final since the Hershey Bears in 2001. The winner of this series will face either the Toronto Marlies or Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins in the Calder Cup Final.

SCOUTING THE WOLVES- Chicago has been led in the playoffs by forward Ryan Suzuki who has posted 10 points in 11 games, while fellow forwards Felix Unger Sorum and Bradley Nadeau each have nine points. Goalie Cayden Primeau has started all 11 games, sporting a 7-4 record to go along with a 2.35 GAA and .924 save-percentage. The Eagles finished 1-1-2 against the Wolves during the regular season. Colorado forward T.J. Tynan spent two seasons with Chicago, amassing 131 points in 141 regular season games and helping lead the Wolves to the Calder Cup Final in 2019.

PLAYOFF BUILT- Forward Tristen Nielsen notched a goal and an assist in the Eagles 5-2 win over Chicago in Game Two on Saturday, now giving him a team-leading eight goals and 13 points through the first 12 games of the postseason. A Calder Cup Champion with the Abbotsford Canucks in 2025, Nielsen is tied for the team lead with three power-play goals and also paces the Eagles with five multi-point efforts, having posted a goal and an assist in each of his last three games. The fifth-year pro led Colorado with 28 goals during the regular season and also made his NHL debut, posting one assist in four contests with the Colorado Avalanche.

FINISH STRONG- The Eagles put up four goals in the final five minutes of the third period in Game Two on Saturday, as Colorado continued to bolster its jaw-dropping numbers in the final frame. Through the first 12 games of the Calder Cup Playoffs, the Eagles have outscored the opposition 18-5 in the third period and own a record of 6-0 when carrying a lead into the second intermission. On the flip side, Chicago has been outscored 11-8 in the third period this postseason.

YOUNG GUN- Eagles forward T.J. Hughes scored the game-winning goal and added an assist in Game Two, now giving him four goals and five assists in the postseason, including points in four straight. Hughes is fresh off a four-year career at the University of Michigan where he produced 179 points in 156 NCAA contests. This season saw him put up a career-high 22 goals and 35 assists while serving as the Wolverines captain, helping him earn Big Ten Player of the Year honors, while also being named an All-American and a Hobey Baker Finalist. His 57 points were good for second in the nation.

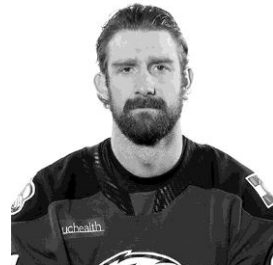

Army, 34, is in his first season with the Eagles and most recently was the Head Coach of the ECHL's Wheeling Nailers, where he was the winningest coach in franchise history. After being tabbed a midseason replacement in 2020-21, Army received the full-time head coaching duties ahead of the 2021-22 season and held that position each of the last four campaigns. Including his stint as the interim bench boss, Army compiled a 153-137-19 record from 2020-25 and qualified for the Kelly Cup Playoffs in three of those seasons, including each of the last two. Army also held the Director of Hockey Operations title from 2021-25.

A native of North Kingstown, R.I., Army began his coaching career serving as an assistant with the ECHL's Worcester Railers over parts of the 2018-20 seasons. Weiss was hired as the Eagles video coach on August 7, 2024. The team finished with a share of the third-best record in the league last season and qualified for the 2025 Calder Cup Playoffs, advancing to the Division Finals. She was promoted to assistant coach on January 16, 2026 and joins Seattle Kraken assistant Jessica Campbell as the only women in the NHL or AHL to have an Assistant Coach title in a full-time role.

A native of Potomac, Md., Weiss was a guest coach for the Avalanche in 2023-24 and worked each of the last four Avalanche Development Camps in various capacities. Outside the Avs' organization, she most recently served as an Assistant Coach for the Trinity College Men's Hockey program in 2023-24 where the team finished as the NCAA DIII runner-up. Prior to coaching at her alma matter, Weiss' coaching career includes stints with the NAHL's Maryland Black Bears and AAA Washington Pride programs.

Weiss is a member of the National Hockey League Coaches Association Female Coaches Program and has been a featured speaker in the organization's mentorship program. She is involved with USA Hockey's player development camps in the summer as well as the Coaching Education Program. Kim is a USA Hockey Level 5 certified coach and graduated from Georgetown Visitation School in Washington, DC.

A former collegiate hockey player, Weiss played at Trinity College from 2007-11, serving as team captain as a junior and senior. She was a first-team All-American and NESCAC Player of the Year as a senior in 2010-11. As a junior, she helped guide the Bantams to an NCAA Tournament bid for the first time in program history. Weiss was a four-time All-NESCAC honoree and remains the program's all-time leading scorer.

Career Notes:

Letestu, 41, is in his first season with the Eagles, after spending the previous four seasons as an Assistant Coach with the AHL's Cleveland Monsters. In that span, the Monsters compiled a 136-117-23-16 regular-season record from the 2021-22 to 2024-25 seasons. Additionally, the club qualified for the Calder Cup Playoffs each of the last two campaigns, including capturing the North Division title in 2023-24 and advancing to the Conference Finals that year before falling to the eventual champion Hershey Bears. Letestu also coached one season in the Alberta Junior Hockey League (AJHL) ranks as an assistant in 2012-13.

A centerman in his playing days, Letestu's tenure with Cleveland saw the team boast a 60-point scorer in each of the last two seasons, while clearing 200 goals as a team all four campaigns – finishing as high as ninth in the AHL in 2023-24 with 233. That 2023-24 season also saw the team rank in the AHL's top-half in power-play percentage (20.7%, 11th) and power-play goals (62, 7th). The Monsters' back-to-back Calder Cup Playoff berths marked the first time the franchise ever accomplished the feat.

Prior to his first pro coaching job in 2021-22, Letestu played parts of 14 seasons of professional hockey after being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Pittsburgh Penguins on March 22, 2007. The pro career includes 567 regular-season games in the NHL with the Blue Jackets, Penguins, Edmonton Oilers and Winnipeg Jets. He registered 210 career points (93g/117a) and added 15 points (6g/9a) in 36 Stanley Cup Playoff contests. The Elk Point, Alberta, native also suited up in 255 regular-season games in the AHL, six in the ECHL and seven in Sweden's Allsvenskan league, giving him a total of 835 career regular-season games in professional leagues from 2006-20.

Letestu played one season at Western Michigan University (2006-07) and three for Bonnyville in the AJHL (2002-05) prior to competing professionally. He was tabbed the AJHL's Most Valuable Player in 2005-06 after pacing the league with 105 points (50g/55a).
